THE REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BUENA WAS HELD MONDAY, JUNE 28, 2021 COMMENCING AT 7:00 P.M. VIA TELECONFERENCING WITH MAYOR ZAPPARIELLO PRESIDING. MAYOR ZAPPARIELLO CALLED FOR A MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR THOSE AFFECTED BY COVID-19 AND ANNOUNCED THAT THIS MEETING WAS BEING HELD IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT AND NOTICES OF THIS MEETING HAVE BEEN PROVIDED, VIA EMAIL, TO THE PRESS OF ATLANTIC CITY, THE DAILY JOURNAL AND THE ATLANTIC COUNTY RECORD ON DECEMBER 1, 2020 AS WELL AS BEING POSTED ON THE BOROUGH WEBSITE. **MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Mayor Zappariello opened the meeting asking for a moment of silence for those affected by COVID.

Mayor Zappariello called on Engineer Smith for an update on issues ongoing in the Borough. Mr. Smith did not have an update on drainage however, he stated that the contractor will be working on the swale opposite Kimberly Lane on June 29, 2021.

With regard to the Landisville Fire Company, Mayor Zappariello stated he received a closeout letter from the Department of Health certifying the remaining six issues were abated. Mayor Zappariello asked Solicitor Costigan to contact the attorney for the Department for a list of records such as a current list of firefighters, training records, and records related to equipment. The mayor wants this information no later than July 7, 2021, leaving enough time to review prior to the next meeting of the governing body. If all documents are in order, a resolution reinstating the Department will be placed on the next agenda for Council's consideration.

**PUBLIC PORTION OF THE MEETING:**

Brian Rowan, a former Landisville Firefighter, stated that he submitted an OPRA request to the fire commissioners on May 29, 2021, for residency requirements for the chief and assistant chief according to their bylaws. After receiving no response, on June 10, 2021, Mr. Rowan re-submitted the request. Mr. Rowan did not receive a response from the commissioners; however, he did receive an email from Chief Barbagli stating in part that the fire company is not a governmental agency and therefore not required to respond. Mr. Rowan said he disagreed with this decision because the Landisville Volunteer Fire Company is a political subdivision of the Borough of Buena. Mr. Rowan further stated that he had filed a complaint with the state due to retaliation and discrimination when made aware that a claim was made accusing his brother of wrongfully disseminating non-public information, specifically, Chief Barbagli's address. Mr. Rowan categorically denied this claim and stated Mr. Barbagli's information was presented at the special meeting of May 26, 2021, when a reference was made to filing a false police report.

**WHEREAS**, due to the rising cost of Governmental Services it is incumbent upon local governments to seek ways to streamline and share services so as to reduce the tax burden upon local government constituents; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey encourages the concept of shared services and specifically authorizes shared services pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1 requires every municipality to establish a municipal court either on a stand-alone basis or by entering into an agreement to establish a joint municipal court with two or more municipalities pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1(b) or by entering into a shared court arrangement with two or more municipalities pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1(c); and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Buena is in a joint municipal court arrangement with Franklin Township pursuant N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1(c); and

**WHEREAS**, Atlantic County Executive Dennis Levinson, by letter dated July 17, 2020 invited the County's 23 municipalities to explore the establishment of a county based municipal court and tasked Atlantic County Counsel to lead a committee consisting of interested municipal officials; Judges and officials of the Atlantic County Court System; and

**WHEREAS**, officials from various municipalities, along with representatives of the Superior Court participated in committee meetings to establish the framework for a countywide municipal court; and

**WHEREAS**, those discussions included discussions by County Counsel and court representatives with the Atlantic County Mayors' Association and the Atlantic County Police Chiefs' Association; and

**WHEREAS**, County Counsel and one or more court representatives have made presentations to the governing bodies of various municipalities concerning this program; and

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**WHEREAS**, those discussions have resulted in a document entitled Agreement Establishing the Central Municipal Court of Atlantic County (the “Agreement”), which document establishes the formation of a countywide municipal court and the respective rights and obligations of the respective parties; and

**WHEREAS**, the Agreement calls for the Central Municipal Court to commence operations as of January 1, 2022 and is for an initial ten (10) year term; and

**WHEREAS**, the governing body of the Borough of Buena has had an opportunity to review the Agreement and all of its details; and

**WHEREAS**, the Agreement will result in substantial budgetary savings to the Municipality and will enable the Municipality to make more efficient use of its police resources and will result in better utilization of municipal office space and otherwise benefits the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this municipality; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Municipal Council of the Borough of Buena that it does hereby authorize the mayor to execute the Agreement and does hereby agree to undertake all of the necessary steps to dissolve its current municipal court arrangement and to commence its membership in the Central Municipal Court of Atlantic County effective January 1, 2022.

**WHEREAS**, the Atlantic County Board of Taxation is unable to certify the tax rate and therefore, the Municipal Tax Collector will also be unable to mail tax bills on a timely basis; and

**WHEREAS**, the Municipal Tax Collector in consultation with the Municipal Chief Financial Officer has computed an estimated tax levy in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3, and they have signed a certification showing the tax levies for the previous year, the tax rates and the range of permitted tax levies.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Buena as follows:

1. The Municipal Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue estimated tax bills for the municipality for the third installment of 2021 taxes. The Tax collector shall proceed and take such actions as permitted by N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.2 and 54:4-66.3.

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2. The estimated tax levy for 2021 is \$9,543,077.02.
3. The Municipal Tax Collector must mail the estimated tax bills to property owners no later than June 30, 2021.
4. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3, the third installment of 2021 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of; the grace period or the 25th, (twenty fifth) calendar day after the estimated tax bills are mailed. The estimated tax bills shall contain a notice specifying the date which interest may begin to accrue.

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.
